

EDEN is a curious place, where silence is seen as peace, ignorance is called purity, and obedience labeled as virtue.


EVE, in such a world, is subordinate to her man. Hence, a woman's virtues lie in her "niceness" and obedience. Eve's rebellion must be condemned.





In the authoritative system of the Church. Eve's act of eating the forbidden fruit to gain knowledge is framed as the "original sin". And no matter how much we repent in this life, we, as the descendants of Eve, can never undo the "wrong" our ancestor had done to god.

In the liberating framework of the Ethics of Care, Eve is our heroine. She had Chosen the truth instead of Heaven, and our human story of multiplicities Could begin.

The west, in their colonial conquest for wealth and power, subjugated the world under its own mythology of sin, shame, punishment, and the glorification of ignorance.

The association of knowledge with evilness reflects deep cultural anxieties about power. Control. and the human condition.

In the narrative. knowledge doesn't merely represent intellectual understanding—it symbolizes awareness of Complexity. morality. and consequences. things that challenge the simplicity of an obedient existence. knowledge was dangerous because it threatened the established order: it empowered individuals to question, to choose, and to act independently. In a way, equating knowledge with evilness is less about the act of knowing itself and more about the fear of what happens when people break free from prescribed boundaries.

But in Contrary to the bible, we are now learning that allowing multiplicities and Complexities are the only way we can practice liberating love.
